History of Angus-Young Associates, Inc. Ownership Transitions Management Transitions Name changes The firm was established in 1956 when Lincoln F. Frelich, AIA, and James J. Angus, AIA, became partners in the firm of Frelich-Angus and Associates in Janesville. The firm offered professional services in architecture and planning and was oriented toward institutional clients.

Lincoln Frelich, AIA, received his degree in architecture from Illinois Institute of Technology; James Angus, AIA, graduated from Princeton, and continued his graduate work at Illinois Institute of Technology. Roger Young, AIA, a graduate of Iowa State University, became a partner of the firm in 1972. The name of the firm changed to Frelich-Angus-Young Architects. This combination of principals continued until 1981 when Lincoln Frelich, AIA, retired, and the firm became known as Angus-Young Architects, S.C.

The firm of Angus-Young Architects was reorganized in 1986 by virtue of ownership changes, and became known as Angus-Young Associates, Inc. The change included principal ownership by Gordon Buitendorp and James Vanderveen, owners of the GMB Architecture + Engineering firm of Holland, MI. The expansion enabled the Janesville-based Angus-Young Associates to present a full range of architectural and engineering services and handle a larger variety of projects for their clients.

In 1987, Jeffrey Hazekamp, AIA, joined the firm as the Managing Principal of the Janesville office. Joseph J. Stadelman, AIA, joined the firm in January of 1988 and became a principal in 1992. In 1990, Angus-Young Associates acquired the firm of Rose Associates/Architects. Between 1993 and 1997, Jeffrey Hazekamp and Joseph Stadelman acquired 90% of the firm from Mr. Buitendorp and Mr. Vanderveen of GMB. James J. Angus, AIA, passed away in 1996, ending a career of over 40 years.

In 1997 the new principal ownership now in Wisconsin agreed to a working affiliation between the Michigan offices of GMB AE. The affiliation brings the advantages of a large firm with a small firm economy and management. The combined staff totals over 100 employees.

In 2004, Zachary Goswick, P.E., becomes a shareholder in the firm, managing structural engineering efforts of the firm.

Zachary Goswick, P.E., in 2007 becomes a principal in the firm and takes the role of Managing Engineer as Brad Heeres, P.E., stays on the Board of Directors of Angus-Young Associates, Inc. but moves his residence to Michigan and re-joins the affiliate office of GMB AE Associates heading up the electrical engineering division.

Today, Angus-Young Associates, Inc. remains a closely held corporation with majority ownership retained by Jeffrey Hazekamp, AIA, President; and minority ownership by Joseph Stadelman, AIA; Zachary Goswick, P.E.; Bradley Heeres, P.E.; Harm Perdock, AIA; and Robert Botting, P.E. Other shareholders include Jeff Davis, AIA; Jason LaRosh, P.E.; and Katie Udell, LA.
